Day1/U.S.
March 21

Depart the U.S.

Flight to China. Depart on board overnight flight to Shanghai. All meals served on board as well as complimentary beverages, movies, and earphones for your comfort.

Day 2/Shanghai
March 22

Arrive Shanghai

Upon arrival in Shanghai, the biggest City of China, a representative from InterCulture Tours will meet you at the airport and accompany you to your hotel in Shanghai. Welcome dinner after short break. Leisure time in the evening for the group to explore the city on its own.

Day 3/Shanghai
03/23/08

The Bund, Shanghai Children’s Palace, Pudong New District, Oriental Pearl Tower, CONCERT #1

The day starts with a walking tour at the picturesque Bund along the Huangpu River. Visit Shanghai Children’s Palace to observe how Chinese teenagers learn music and art. Tour of Pudong Business District to experience the China’s economic development. You will have an opportunity to get on the Oriental Pearl Tower, one of the tallest buildings in the world. Rehearsal and stage set up later this afternoon before the concert performance this evening.

Day 4/Shanghai
03/24/08

Yuyuan Garden, Town’s God” Temple Market, Shanghai Museum Acrobatic Show, UCLA STORE PERFORMANCE #1

City tour starts with a visit to the tranquil Yuyuan Garden, the best example of classical gardens of Shanghai. Make a tour of discovery of local Folklore and Ming and Qing Dynasty architecture in the lively “Town’s God” Temple Market and souvenir shopping for family and friends. The Shanghai Museum at the People's Square boasts a vast collection of exhibits, world-class architecture, and high-tech facilities. Enjoy a world-class acrobatic show this evening.

Day 5/Shanghai
03/25/08

Fuxing Park, French Concession and Shikumen Architecture, Silk Factory, CONCERT #2

The Fuxing Park is the only French designed park in Shanghai, and is a

famous place for Shanghai-ers to relax and take in the sun. It also has an (in)famous statue of Marx and Engels. The French Concession is a charming area known for its cafes and shops, and for Shikumen Architecture Housing. Stop at a silk factory before going to Shanghai Jiaotong University for evening concert.

Day 6/Beijing
03/26/08

Forbidden City, Tiananmen Square, CONCERT #3

Flight to Beijing this morning. Begin the day with a visit to the vast Tiananmen Square, the largest public space in the world in the heart of modern China. A tour of Forbidden City follows. The massive 15-century complex of palaces, courtyards and gardens was once home to the emperors of Ming and Qing dynasties. Concert this evening.

Concert venue: People's University Concert Hall

Day 7/Beijing
03/27/08

Great Wall, Jade Museum, 2008 Olympics Game Stadium, UCLA STORE PERFORMANCE #2

An emblem of Chinese civilization, a cultural phenomenon of world caliber, the Great Wall is a must see. Stop at the Jade Museum to learn how Jade is sculptured into art pieces. Photo opportunities at the "Bird Nest", the 2008 Olympics Games Stadium.

Day 8/Beijing
03/28/08

Summer Palace, Hutong Tour, CONCERT #4

Built in 1750, Summer Palace is by far the best-preserved imperial garden in China, it was endorsed by the UNESCO in 1998 as a world cultural heritage site. The entire place is a de facto museum of China's classical architecture. Housed in these buildings are an immense collection of treasures and cultural artifacts. Then explore one of Beijing's oldest neighborhoods as you go on a fascinating trishaw ride through the narrow lanes of a Hutong, one of Beijing's traditional neighborhood. Later afternoon rehearsal in the concert hall before the evening concert.

Concert venue: Beijing Concert Hall or Baoli Theatre

Day 9/Beijing
03/29/08

Depart China for U.S.

Flight back to the U.S. today. Transfer by private motor coach with assistance to Beijing International airport for departure.
